Holy Spirit CES Re-Entry Plan 2021-2022

Elementary Start Dates

All students will begin on Wednesday, September 8th, 2021. There are no staggered entry dates this year. Supervision begins at 8:10 a.m. and school starts at 8:25 a.m.

Before Arriving at School

All parents/guardians are asked to complete the <u>York Region Public Health Child Care</u> <u>Assessment</u> with their child before departing for school. This tool may be updated so please check the York Region Public Health website regularly for updated information. There is also a video of <u>Covid-19 Hygiene For Kids</u> should you wish to view and discuss Covid-19 hygiene with your child.

Any student experiencing Covid-19 symptoms **must** remain home.

Kiss and Ride

Please remember that the Kiss and Ride is not a parking lot. Should you wish to park and drop off your students, there are a limited number of parking spaces available at the front of the school. If there are no parking spots available, please park on the street (by-law permitting) and safely walk your child to school.

If you have a low profile car, please stop a safe distance away from the curb to ensure your door opens safely. Lastly, please do not block the bus loop as buses will need to exit as part of their scheduled day.

<u>Masks</u>

- Students in Grades 1 to 8 **are required** to wear properly fitted non-medical or cloth masks indoors at school, including in hallways and during classes, as well as on school vehicles (i.e. buses)
- It is **strongly recommended** that students in Kindergarten wear non-medical or cloth masks in indoors while at school, as well as on school vehicles (i.e. buses), as tolerated
- Students will be required to safely store their mask while outdoors (i.e. in a pocket or cloth bag/fanny pack brought from home)
- Masks will be temporarily removed indoors to consume food or drink

Kindergarten Entry

- Students can be dropped off at the doors of the Kindergarten and their teacher as well as support staff will welcome them and walk them to their classroom
- Classroom ECE's will be in the room to welcome our students
- Once parents and caregivers drop off their children, we ask kindly that you immediately leave the area to avoid congestion
- All parents/caregivers coming to the school are asked to wear masks while on school property

Grades 1 to 8 Entry

- Please arrive as close to 8:25 a.m. (bell time) as possible.
- Parents can walk their children to the school yard where staff will be there to greet the students
- We kindly ask that parents and caregivers immediately leave the area after dropping off their child/children to avoid large crowds and congestion
- All parents/caregivers coming to the school are asked to wear masks on school property; parents are not to congregate at the doors, yard, or gate
- On the first day of school, teachers will show their students where and how to line up in the morning and for recesses, as well as provide instructions on physical distancing measures

All parents must follow the instructions provided for drop off in accordance with our Board and school Re-Entry Plan. While we acknowledge the first day of school is both a special and memorable day, for everyone's safety and security we must maintain physical distancing protocols to the best of our ability.

Recess

There will no longer be staggered recesses. All students will have the same recesses. Students will **not** be wearing their masks while outdoors as directed by YRPH. Recess will continue to occur under teacher and support staff supervision. Students will be encouraged to stay in their cohorts whenever possible and must stay in their designated divisional area. Students will be encouraged to maintain social distancing.

Upon returning to the classroom, students will wash/sanitize their hands and put their mask back on. Teachers will be reviewing yard areas as well as proper mask etiquette with all students upon their return to school.

<u>Lunch</u>

Students will eat their lunch at their own desk and all food/drinks/snacks must be brought from home, respecting our safe school allergy policy as we are an allergy-safe school. Students are not to share food, utensils, or drinks and must sanitize their hands before eating as well as when entering and exiting the building.

Student who go home for lunch can return in the afternoon. Parents are <u>not</u> to drop off lunches for their children as per the YCDSB re-entry plan policy.

Staggered Dismissal

- FDK and Grades 1, 2, 3 will begin their dismissal 15 minutes early at 2:40 p.m.
 - Kindergartens will be dismissed from the Kindergarten Yard
 - Grades 1 to 3 will exit from the Primary doors
- Grades 4, 5, 6 will begin their dismissal at 2:50 p.m.
 - Our Grades 4 and 5 classes will exit from the Before and After Care doors
 - Grade 6 students will exit from the Intermediate doors
- Grades 7 and 8 will be dismissed at bell time 2:55 p.m.
 - o Intermediate students will exit from the Intermediate doors

Suggested September Materials

- A refillable water bottle to be used at our water filling stations (fountains are only available to refill bottles)
- Students are asked to bring a lunch and 2 snacks from home with them in the morning
- Personal school supplies such as pencils, pens, markers, erasers, scissors, pencil sharpener, glue, pencil case, pencil crayons, ruler, etc...
- Students in Grade 1 to 8 are asked to bring **3-4 non-medical grade masks** together with a paper or cloth bag to store it in
- Extra masks are available at school should the mask become damaged or soiled
- Teachers will communicate to their classes should there be other items needed in a class letter

<u>Visitors</u>

Visitors are not to enter the school during hours of operation unless identified through a prearranged meeting. It is expected that parents/guardians **contact the school by telephone first at (905) 713-6813 if assistance is required**. Visitors may only be allowed to enter upon invitation after they have reviewed the self-assessment notification posted at the front door.

Visitors are expected to sanitize their hands upon entry and wear a mask at all times. If visitors are invited to enter the office, they are kindly reminded to respect two-metres of physical distance at all times. As usual, all permitted visitors must confirm their arrival by signing in/out. If a parent/guardian needs to meet with the Principal or teacher, **the meeting must be scheduled in advance**.

Programs and Volunteers

Our hot lunch program continues to be on hold until further notice.

Indoor Shoes

Students are encouraged to bring indoor and outdoor shoes as our hooks and cubbies can be used.

Medical Forms
