Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s),

It was very exciting to have our students and staff back in the school this week. As a school community we continue to follow the guidelines of the YCDSB School Re-entry Plan for a safe return to school. This plan involves a three-tiered approach that includes **physical distancing**, **hand and respiratory hygiene**, **and non-medical mask-wearing**.

I kindly ask that as we begin the second week of school, **parents refrain from entering the school yard to drop-off students**. If your child is in Kindergarten, please wait behind the Kindergarten Gate. If they are in Primary we ask you to wait behind the yellow gate and if they are in Junior/Intermediate that you remain on the grass near the park. This will help to ensure the safety of all of our students.

This week agendas have been distributed to Primary and Junior students in their classrooms. We kindly ask that if you would like to keep the agendas that parents submit a cheque for \$6.00 payable to Holy Spirit CES in a sealed ziplock bag, labelled with your child's name and teacher.

Bus Seating Plan Update

Each school bus will have a seating plan. Our staff currently reviews the seating plan every evening before the bus departs from school. As the seating plan is solidified (as updates continue to be uploaded to our system), we will send parents an email indicating their child's seat.

If there is a change in plans regarding your child taking the bus after school, please ensure a note is sent to the classroom teacher and the office.

Visitors

As outlined in our re-entry plan below, there are no visitors allowed in the school as per the policies set out by York Region Public Health. For the safety of our students, we ask that there be no visitors in the school unless a pre-arranged appointment is made.

- FDK and Grades 1, 2, 3 will begin their dismissal 15 minutes early at 2:40 pm.
 - Kindergartens will be dismissed from the Kindergarten Yard
 - Grades 1 to 3 will exit from the Primary doors.
- Grades 4, 5, 6 will begin their dismissal at 2:50 p.m.
 - Our Grades 4 and 5 classes will exit from the staff parking lot doors.
 - Grade 6 students will exit from the Intermediate doors.
- Grades 7 and 8 will be dismissed at bell time 2:55 p.m.
 - \circ $\;$ Intermediate students will exit from the Intermediate doors.
